Wanda Sells, Secretary, Married to James E. Sells, 1965-1969 MM1 SS

Jim was assigned to the Nautilus January, 1965 right after we were married. I met him while he was going to Nuclear Power School in Idaho. Our adventures on the Nautilus were amazing but at the time just doing "life" not realizing what an historical adventure we were on. I went to sea on the Nautilus on a wive's crew. The biggest event was when the boat went to Bermuda a few wives and I also went and met the guys there and had a great few days. Right after our return from Bermuda was when the boat had her collision with the Essex. My father in Idaho and Jim's mother in Indiana were notified the ship was gone. I had no idea. The pictures tell an amazing story. During Jim's tenure on the Nautilus I worked in the accounting department for EBASCO building Millstone Nuclear Power Station #1. I was there from ground up starting work in an old wooden house that had a "shady lady" history!! Jim was discharged from the Nautilus May, 1969 where we started civilian life. We have two boys and family life was full of skiing, golf, hiking, camping, soccer, baseball, basketball, lacrosse and wrestling and riding our Harleys! I got involved in the real estate industry and ended up retiring from Wells Fargo as a mortgage lender after 23 years. I retired 7 years ago and fill my days with golf, bridge and family. 
