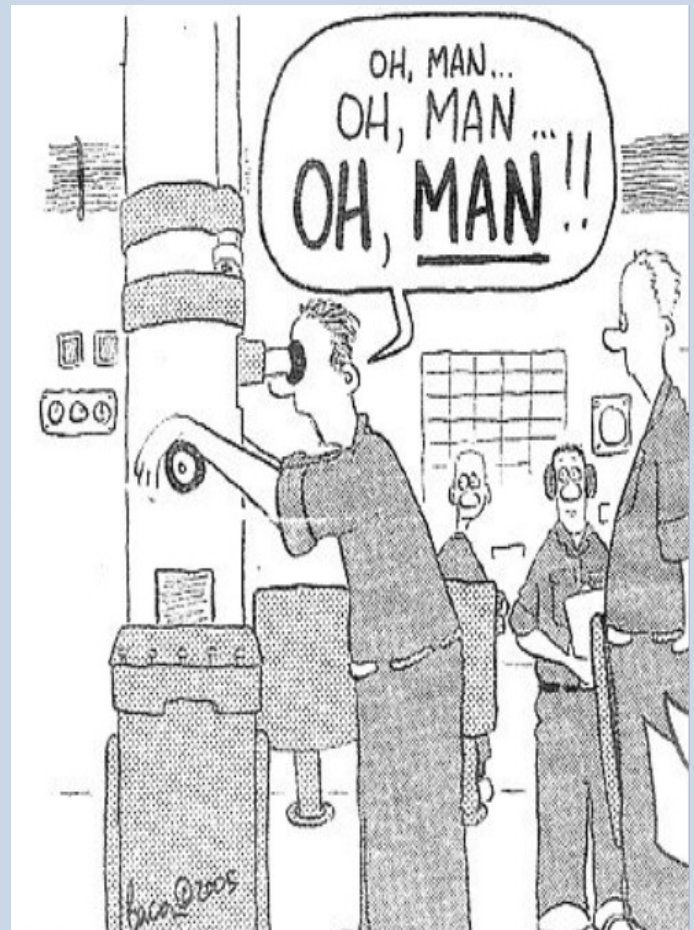

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

Hello to the Nautilus Family!

Ours is a large, rich and diverse family, including current and former Nautilus sailors, their families, and numerous supporters of Nautilus who assist our Association as we strive to ensure the lasting memory of ***The First and Finest*** and keep her forever in the hearts and minds of America.

2026 Reunion: The NAAI Board has decided that the dates for the 2026 Nautilus Reunion will be during the same late September time frame as the 2024 get together. Exact dates will be determined based on best pricing after we complete negotiations with the hotel and the banquet venue, but most likely the dates will be Thursday-Sunday, 24-27 September, with the ability to add a day or two before or after should guests want to stay longer.

Theme: 2026 marks the 40th anniversary of the Submarine Force Library & Museum at its off-base, open to the public location, and the 40th anniversary of Nautilus opening to the public as a historic ship. These anniversaries will be celebrated at the 2026 reunion. Both of these remarkable events occurred on April 11, 1986.

The Board seriously considered having the 2026 reunion in April of 2026 to coincide with the 40th anniversary of these two events, but when we realized the average temperature in Groton in early April is in the chilly 40s and 50s, and that many attractions—such as Abbott’s Lobsters in Noank—are not yet open, the September dates were chosen.

In addition to celebrating Nautilus’s and the Museum’s opening to the public, we want to celebrate the sailors assigned to Historic Ship Nautilus, both current and those assigned since the ship’s opening to the public in 1986. They serve as the backbone of NAAI’s and the Navy’s quest to educate the public about Nautilus and her achievements, and to immortalize her in the annals of American history. A huge emphasis will be placed on including these sailors in our reunion activities and recognizing their importance and accomplishments.

Activities: Wanda Sells and her board member assistants did such a great job with the 2024 reunion that the current board will, for the most part, duplicate the activities from that reunion. The “Sea Stories Night” during which Nautilus sailors recounted their adventures and humorous anecdotes will become Family Sea Stories Night; when family members will talk about their memories and funny stories related to Nautilus. The same evening we’d like to hear some interesting and/or humorous stories from current and former Historic Ship Nautilus sailors related to their service aboard The First and Finest.

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE cont.

Hotel and Venues: We are now in the process of exploring hotels and venues for the reunion. However, many hotels and venues won't negotiate prices or dates more than a year out. Right now, the same hotel and venues used during the 2024 reunion look to be the best, but that may change when we can negotiate in September 2025. The important thing is for all of us to put the dates on your calendars and be prepared to make travel and hotel reservations as soon as the registration form is published in the early fall of this year.

June 14 marked the 60th anniversary of the laying of the keel of the submarine USS Nautilus, America's first nuclear vessel.

The importance of the event, and the vessel, still reverberate with the Holland family, of Belleview, and John Baccoli, of Ocala, and will be commemorated during a ceremony Saturday at the Ocala-Marion County Veterans Memorial Park.

June 14 marked the 60th anniversary of the laying of the keel of the submarine USS Nautilus, America's first nuclear vessel.

The importance of the event, and the vessel, still reverberate with the Holland family, of Belleview, and John Baccoli, of Ocala, and will be commemorated during a ceremony Saturday at the Ocala-Marion County Veterans Memorial Park.

Frank Holland, an engineman first class in the Nautilus reactor room, was an Ocala native who died at age 80 on April 1, 2011. He served on the Nautilus from 1955 to 1961 and was onboard for the first transit under the North Pole in 1958.

Baccoli, on June 14, 1952, was a 17-year-old Navy journalist with the Naval Submarine Base New London newspaper "Dolphin" and was sent to cover the keel-laying ceremony at the nearby Groton, Conn., shipyard.

"I knew every picture counted," said Baccoli at his residence in Oak Run.

Baccoli, originally from Queens, was assigned to take photos of President Harry S. Truman as he carved his initials into the keel.

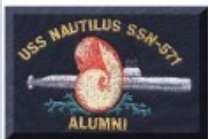
“Can you imagine, a 17-year-old getting a chance to meet the president,” Baccoli said.

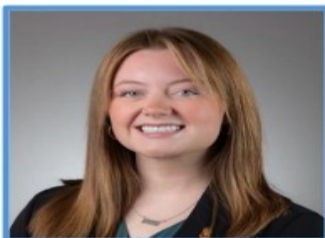

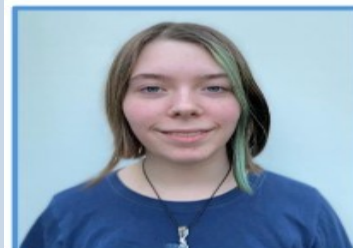

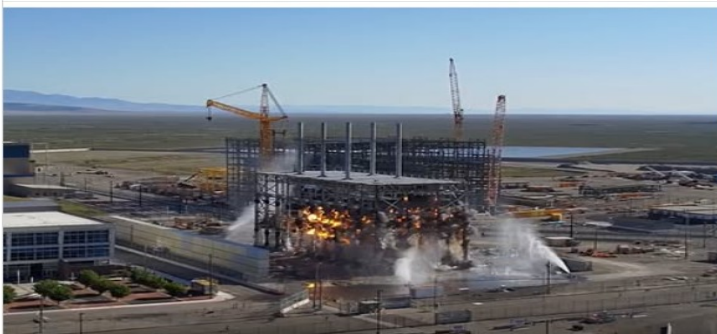

U.S. Department of Energy Office of Environmental Management contractors safely conducted explosive demolition of the S1W (Submarine First Generation Westinghouse Design) Prototype Facility at the Naval Reactors Facility in Idaho.

Explosive demolition was the safest and most cost-effective approach to demolishing this steel facility structure and resulted in more than \$25 million saved in time and resources.

Constructed in 1953, the S1W Prototype trained over 13,000 Naval Nuclear Propulsion Program operators before final shutdown in October 1989. In 2019, **Naval Reactors** partnered with DOE-EM to decontaminate and decommission the three inactive prototypes located at NRF, beginning with S1W.

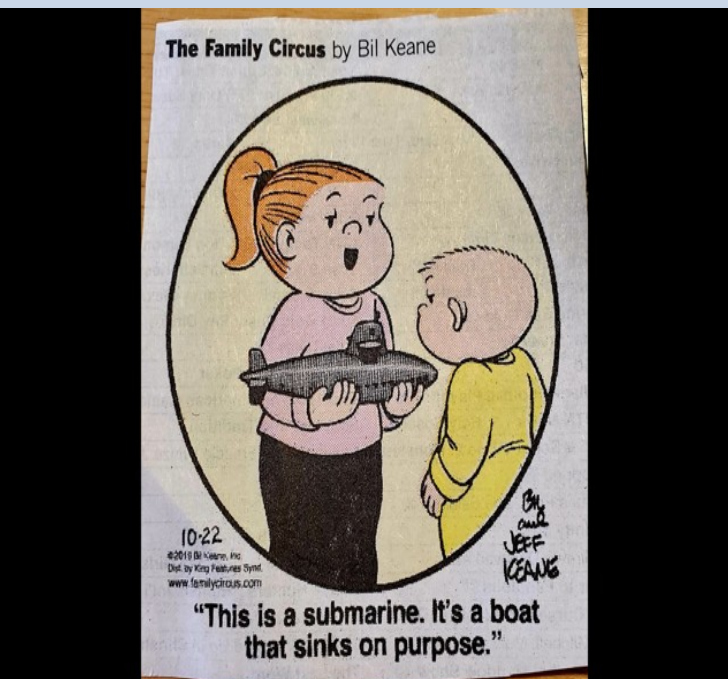

She also sent me the post below about a mural her relative Phillip Boyle (Nautilus 54-59, [Plankowner](#) and [PANOPO](#)) had painted on Railroad property facing his back yard. Impressive!

"Hi Lonnie, here is the photo of the Nautilus painting I mentioned. Uncle Phil had an artist paint it on the railroad wall behind his property in [Woodbridge](#), NJ. It stayed there for several decades until he passed away. At that point, the house was sold and I guess the township painted over it. Unfortunately, the picture has some scratches or some kind of markings on it. I don't know what or how they got there."

"I also found this pic. On the back it says Portland 1958. Looks like Uncle Phil with two other sailors and some visitors. As far as I know, my uncle did not know anyone in Portland, so I'm guessing the other folks were guests on a tour or something. I thought the tall blond sailor behind Uncle Phil might be John [Yuill](#) or John [Karris](#), but not sure. I tried to identify the men from the Nautilus yearbook, which I realize includes a few who were not on Operation Sunshine. I thought the sailor on left could be [Jeff](#) [Armstrong](#) or [Aage](#) [C. Jensen](#), but again, all guesses on my part!"

MMC (SS) Bruce Aquizap Nautilus 1957 to 1962 PANOPO



Sadly, we learned that our shipmate Bruce Aquizap has departed on eternal patrol. Bruce served aboard Nautilus from 1957 to 1962 and was aboard when Nautilus became the first in history to cross the North Pole under the ice and then transit on to the Atlantic Ocean, coining the term PANOPO—Pacific to Atlantic via the North Pole. Bruce was an MMC(SS) aboard Nautilus and later retired from the Navy as a Lieutenant. Bruce leaves a loving family in New Hampshire. Bruce was 92 years old.

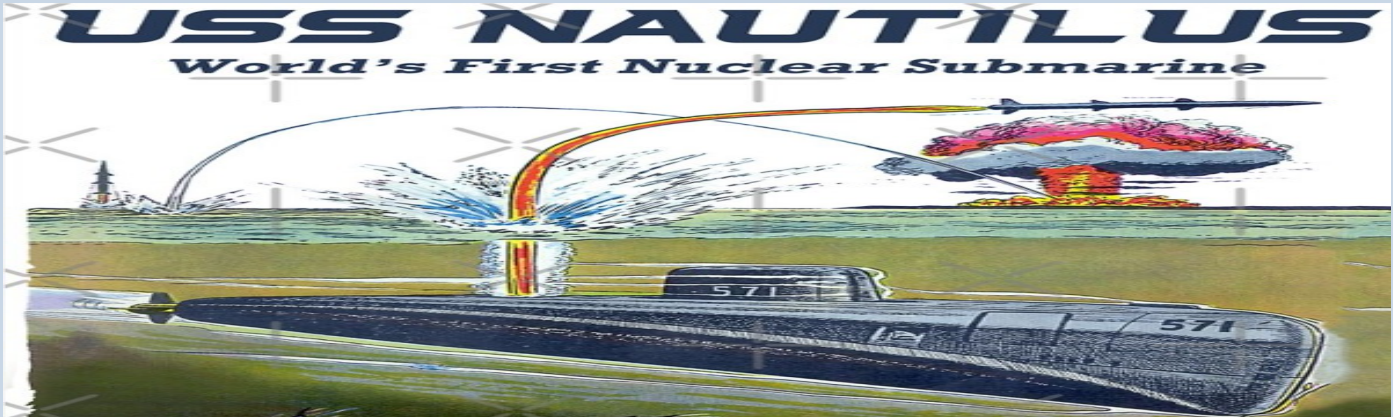
Rick was born on November 27, 1949 in Boston, MA. He is the son of the late Richard M. Manazir, Sr. and Evelyn O’Connell Manazir.
